Extended (Five) Year Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rates "ACGR" for the Class of 2020-2021

The data is based on the cohort of 2016-2017. The cohort of 2016-2017 is the students who entered high school as 9th graders in the Fall of 2016-2017 school year.

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What is "extended (five) year adjusted cohort graduation rate (ACGR)"?

- An extended-year ACGR is calculated to include students who graduate from high school in one or more additional years beyond their cohort's original four years in high school. For example, for a given year, a five-year ACGR is the number of students who receive a regular high school diploma five years after their cohort started in the 9th grade.
- If students take longer than four years to graduate (in this case five years), they are not included as graduates in the four-year cohort graduation rate. Instead, they are included as graduates in the extended (five) year cohort graduation rate.
- The same business rules that are applied to the four-year adjusted cohort graduation rate process are applied to the extended year cohort process. It starts with the first-time 9th graders of the 2016-2017 school year, and for the next five years, student status is tracked for graduation.



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
