Mission Statement

Vision: All Nevada students are equipped and feel empowered to attain their vision of success.

Superintendent's Highlights

Graduation Rates:

The Class of 2022 graduation rate increased for the Class of 2022, despite challenges posed by the pandemic. The graduation rate for the Class of 2022 rose to 81.7 percent. That is up from 81.3 percent the year before. In 11 of Nevada's 17 school districts as well as the State Public Charter School Authority (SPCSA), students graduated at a higher rate than the State average of 81.7 percent. Eight of Nevada's 17 school districts showed increases in graduation rates from the previous year, with Eureka School District showing the highest gain. Other districts with year-to-year increases in graduation rates include Clark School District, Elko School District, Humboldt School District, Lander School District, Pershing School District, Washoe School District and White Pine School District. Four districts had 2022 graduation rates that exceeded 90.0 percent. They include: Eureka School District at 100.0 percent, Pershing School District at 96.7 percent, Lincoln School District at 95.5 percent, Humboldt School District at 94.3 percent.

NSPF Star Ratings and School Designations:

The Nevada Department of Education (NDE) has resumed calculating the Nevada School Performance (NSPF) Star Ratings. The Index Scores provided for all NSPF indicators and measures were calculated using 2022-23 accountability data. The NDE designated schools for Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI), Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) and Additional Targeted Support and Improvement (ATSI) based on 2022-23 school year student performance data. In summer 2023, CSI schools were evaluated for possible exit.

Assessment Results:

Nevada completed all assessments for the 2022-23 school year and will provide all assessment results on the Nevada Accountability Portal as mandated. Districts and schools are required to meet the 95% participation rate requirement for Mathematics and English Language Arts (ELA) Criterion Referenced (CRT) assessments. Nevada will report assessment results for 2022-23 and this will be the second consecutive school year of statewide assessments since the COVID 19 pandemic in spring 2020. While the results are an important indicator of academic achievement, they may not necessarily be comparable to assessment results prior to the pandemic.

Academic Growth and Closing Opportunity Gaps:

Academic growth for elementary and middle schools is calculated using two consecutive years of data. Nevada continues to analyze assessment data for both 2021-22 and 2022-23 school years to ensure that the State's Other Academic Indicators meet minimum n size requirements as well as equal representation of student populations across districts and schools.

Chronic Absenteeism:

Chronic absenteeism, as a measure of Student Engagement for the NSPF, was modified in accordance with Nevada Senate Bill (SB) 249 passed during the 81st Legislative Session (2021). In accordance with SB 249, districts may excuse a student from attendance with satisfactory written evidence that a child's physical or mental condition or behavioral health prevents attendance at school. SB 249 stipulates "the excusal must not negatively affect the rating of a public school as determined by the Department

pursuant to the statewide system of accountability for public schools” (NRS 392.050, section 4). With the implementation of SB 249, Nevada has been applying a revised methodology for calculating chronic absenteeism for individual schools so that exempt absences in accordance with SB 249 do not count against a school’s NSPF performance or Star Rating. Federal, State, and district chronic absenteeism rate calculations will remain unchanged for uniformity and accuracy in complying with federal and state reporting requirements.

Spanish Translation of the Nevada Accountability Portal:

Nevada has invested in Spanish translation for its Accountability Portal since its September 2022 release. In accordance with ESSA, State’s report cards should use language that helps parents and families understand the information provided to them—which includes translating information that appears on the report card into the state’s commonly spoken languages. In Nevada, Spanish is the most common world and native language after English. Providing the Nevada Accountability Portal in Spanish makes important education information and resources more accessible for non-English speaking communities.
