Superintendent's Highlights

Lyon County School District, with over 9,000 students and 1,100 staff members, is the fourth largest school district in Nevada. LCSD comprises 18 schools in 5 unique attendance areas including Dayton, Fernley, Silver Springs, Smith Valley and Yerington. LCSD also includes LyOnline, which is a full-distance education option for LCSD students. Each school boasts highly qualified, dedicated and caring instructional leaders and staff who work tirelessly to ensure the learning needs of each student are realized. We are very excited to introduce our newly developed Portrait of a Learner, which embodies the learning journey in the LCSD through four domains and multiple competencies. The District motto of "Every Student... Every Classroom... Every Day" comes to life when you step into our schools and see students engaged in rigorous, real-life learning opportunities within the domains of "Learning for Life", "Connected Learners", "Student Ownership", and "Discovery Learning". LCSD is student focused and committed to their success.

We invite all families, citizens, and community leaders to visit our schools and participate in the education of our students. We know that our students will achieve their learning goals and lifelong dreams through the collective work of all adults in Lyon County and the great state of Nevada. Thank you for your continued commitment to our future.

Highlights of Student and Staff Accomplishments:

Classified Staff, Substitutes, Counselors, Special Education Instructors and Nurses from the LCSD family have the opportunity to apply for a Grow Your Own (GYO) Scholarship to continue their education and join the LCSD family when they complete their learning course!

Partnering with Western Nevada College allowed hundreds of students to have dual enrollment and these students will receive high school and college credits simultaneously. In addition, 34 of these students received an Associate's Degree in May 2024. The graduating class of 2023 had 39 students graduate with an Associate's Degree through dual enrollment with Western Nevada College.

A Healthy Communities Coalition partnership secures grant funded social workers and coordinators to help students and their families receive medical, dental, vision and mental health services.

Boys and Girls Club in collaboration with the schools provide enriching before and after school programs for students. All schools have implemented a positive, supportive, and safe learning environment emphasizing social emotional learning through school-based initiatives, to promote a culture of respect.

All schools honor the importance of family engagement through a variety of opportunities, including Booster Clubs, PTA's/PTO's, Parent Universities, Family Science Nights, Student-Led Conferences, etc. Students and staff have raised tens of thousands of dollars and donated thousands of hours to support local families, charities, food banks, blood drives and other community needs.

Students and staff honor veterans, first responders and other inspiring community members through a variety of school events.

District Communication Efforts

La poliza de participacion de padres de el Distrito Escolar Lyon IICD, reconoce que la participacion de los padres es la llave hacia el exito academico. Los padres y los miembros de la comunidad son participantes activos en el proceso de la comunicacion. Como compañeros en la educacion, se fomenta la comunicacion frecuente. El distrito ha desarrollado un plan de comunicacion que puede ser accesible en el sitio de internet del distrito.

Ademas de este trabajo, el distrito usa los siguientes medios para comunicarse: LCSD utiliza Blackboard Mass Communications, un sistema de comunicacion web, y una aplicacion movil que permite a las escuelas para comunicar los eventos planeado y anunciarlos correctamente. Las escuelas tambien usan Infinite Campus para apoyar la comunicacion sobre las ausencias de los estudiantes, y otra informacion importantes. El distrito usa Blackboard Mass Communications y el mensajero de Infinite Campus para notificar a los padres de cualquier situacion de emergencia, eventos por venir, asistencia a las escuelas y para invitarlos a participar.

El superintendente y los empleados de el distrito asisten a juntas de comunidad para alentar comentarios y apoyar una relacion positiva de trabajo. Todas las escuelas tienen comite de consejo de padres que se juntan en una base regular para afrontar problemas que impactan a los estudiantes. La participacion de los padres, le brinda a los padres con entrenamiento y aseguro que los padres participen en el desarrollo de la poliza de participacion.

La lista de actividades para apoyar la participacion de los padres en LCSD incluye: conferencias de padres, comite de consejeria de padres, desiminacion de informacion por medio de folletos, conferencias de padres en las escuelas, talleres para padres, mandando mas correspondencia por medio de carta de noticias, y reporte de calificaciones, brindandoles apoyo a las familias, manteniendo instalaciones seguras y abiertas, y incluyendo a los padres en el proceso de hacer decisiones asi sea apropiado.

LCSD reconoce la extrema importancia de el papel que cada padre juega en el exito academico de nuestros estudiantes, sus

logros y el continuo aprendizaje. Es una expectativa de LCSD que todo y cada uno de los maestros de escuelas haga contacto con los padres de cada estudiante durante el primer mes para establecer un asociación de la escuela al hogar. El sitio internet de LCSD, aplicación móvil, y medios de comunicación social contienen información a tiempo y conexiones para que los padres puedan tener acceso a las escuelas individualmente, y páginas sociales dentro de LCSD.

Los padres y miembros de la comunidad participan regularmente y ofrecen opinión a comités importantes como:

Adicionalmente, todos los padres tienen acceso a las calificaciones, asistencia a clases de sus estudiantes, y el anunciador dentro del sistema de información de LCSD conocido como Infinite Campus (IC). Los padres son invitados a mandarle correo electrónico a sus administradores y maestros por IC como un método de mantener comunicación con los profesores en las vidas de sus hijos. Publicaciones del distrito y las escuelas ofrecen información importante y es una forma de comunicación personal de las escuelas.

LCSD, con el Proyecto de la Ley de Nevada 124 sección 17, ofrece el Código de Honor de Nevada y Participación Educativa de Acuerdo a los Padres. El Código de Honor apoya a la política de Participación de Padres y el Acto Federal Educativo de Primaria y Secundaria. El Código de Honor de Nevada y Participación Educativa de Acuerdo a los Padres refuerza la expectativa de logros y comportamiento de los estudiantes. Estos documentos pueden ser encontrados en la página web de LCSD. LCSD ofrece comunicación apropiada y a tiempo a los padres como es requerida por la ley Federal y la promulgación del estado.

Discipline

The Lyon County School District has taken steps to reduce bullying and cyberbullying through the use of programs such as Second Step (grades K-6) and Character Strong (grades 7-12). These programs help students with social emotional learning and skills intended to prevent Bullying and Cyberbullying. Additionally, students are required to learn Digital Citizenship through their computer science coursework.

Lyon CSD has implemented policy (Policy JFCC) to reduce incidents of bullying in addition to the education awareness programs mentioned above (Second Step and Character Strong). The district also provides annual training for all staff regarding bullying, offers student support services (counseling for both victim and perpetrator) and is adding the use of Navigate 360 to assist in this endeavor. Peer mediation and conflict resolution, the implementation of Positive Behavior Supports (PBIS), parental involvement, the monitoring and evaluation of our annual climate surveys as well as the use of reporting tools such as Safe Voice are just some of the resources offered to reduce the number of incidents of bullying and cyberbullying across the district.

Technology

The Lyon County School District is a 1:1 district, providing Chromebooks for all students in the district as a learning tool. Essentially, the Chromebook is an additional textbook and digital tool for student use. The Lyon County School District has incorporated the "H.A.C.K. Model" for technology integration that was developed based on Webb's Depth of Knowledge Framework. While the Lyon CSD has taken steps to ensure Educational Technology is incorporated effectively through the adoption and purchase of curriculum, training of teachers and their professional development, we continue to make improvements and adjustments to the effective incorporation of technology.

Lyon CSD has developed a technology plan, provides professional development with the H.A.C.K. model, improved access for students and teachers, and has implemented content from Code.org as well as implemented the use of CodeHS for our computer science courses. We evaluate our success through classroom walkthroughs, student outcomes and projects, as well as STEM activities.
